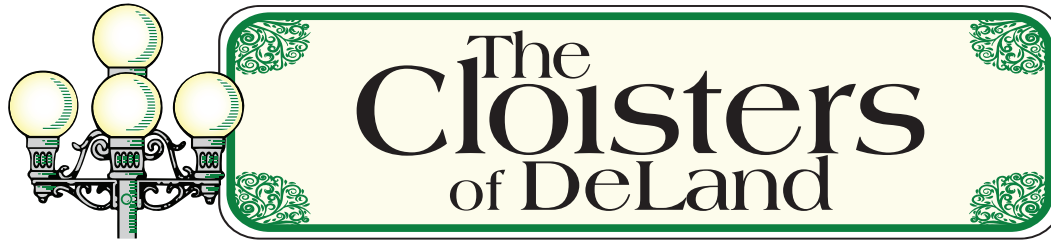

### Resident Spotlight

As early as his 14th birthday, good neighbor David Harvey knew that he would devote his life's work to sharing the teachings of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Unlike his minister father, however, David's strong personal connection with the family of God, led him beyond his human family to pursue studies that would prepare him for the missionary life. Humility prevents David from tooting his own horn pertaining to his educational preparation, so it must be tooted for him. Following his attendance in three colleges, he finally received his doctorate degree in theology and missions from Columbia International University and Trinity College in Chicago, Illinois. He had already met his future wife Peggy in his father's church. As the daughter of missionary parents and born in Africa herself, their assignment to Guinea in West Africa was not unfamiliar to Peggy. Except when they were on furlough, the couple remained in Africa for 31 years, teaching not only from Scripture but by sharing

their personal experiences of God's love to hundreds of natives. Peggy soldiered on wherever needed delivering babies and whatever else came to their door. All that while raising their own two children! These days, Dr. David Harvey is far from retired. He continues his ministry here in The Cloisters every Tuesday at 10:00 a.m. in the Chapel. Whether those attending come looking for a message of hope during these troubled times or simply wish to be part of the pure joy created by David's soft-spoken sharing of Scripture accompanied by the music of Wanda Roberts and Gerry Adams, no one goes away disappointed. David's message: "Jesus wants us to know that he loves us," and in reply to those who might have doubts, David says simply but profoundly, "Jesus is the answer."

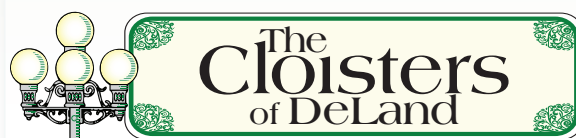


### Bobbie Jo Alexander
